Why take advanced courses?

- Students can earn both high school and college credit for AP and DCC courses.
- Colleges like to see that students have challenged themselves academically. Grades earned in these courses are also weighted higher in a student's GPA.
- Students build academic skills that help to prepare them for college and career.
- Students are able to explore content areas that they find interesting.

Financial support is available.

- Each end-of-course AP Exam that students must take in order to earn college credit costs \$98, or \$62 for students who qualify for Free- or Reduced-Priced meals.
- The cost-per-credit for DCC courses is 1/3 the standard cost at DCC, or \$201 for a 3-credit course and \$268 for a 4-credit course. The cost is further reduced by 1/2 for students who qualify for Free- or Reduced-Priced meals.
